



Phlebotomy Certificate Program

A job- ready skill workshop for healthcare professionals

About our program:

The Phlebotomy Certificate program is a stand alone program to prepare for the Certified Phlebotomy Technician credential offered by the Canadian Phlebotomy Technician Group Inc. (CPTG). The CPT credential eligibility requires post-secondary studies in health sciences or work experience. This program is designed to fill the gaps for the candidates who will like to challenge the CPT exam. The program is also open for Internationally Educated Health Professionals. The CPT exam fees (one attempt) and the CPTG membership fees are included as part of the program admission.

Who should take the course:

- Ontario Secondary School Diploma (70% score or higher in English, Maths and Biology)
- Undergraduate students in health and life sciences (University students are also accepted)
- Post-secondary certificate or Diploma in Health Sciences (e.g., PSW Certificate)
- Internationally Educated Health Professionals

Course duration:

Hybrid program of **39 hours** in total.

- Instructor-led Zoom sessions on six weekday - evening hours (27 hours)
- In person - two days (12 hours) from 10am to 4pm

Course outline:

- Module 1: Standards of Practice & Ethics; Canadian Healthcare (1 day)
- Module 2: Anatomy, Physiology & Medical Terminology (1 day)
- Module 3: Asepsis, Infection Control and WHMIS (1 day)
- Module 4: Phlebotomy – Basic (3 days including 1 day in-person)
- Module 5: Phlebotomy - Procedure (3 days including 1 day in-person)



Objectives:

This program is based on live learning activities which include Knowledge-Based Learning Activities and Practice-Based Learning Activities. Upon successful completion of this course the student will be able to:

- Provide accurate, up-to-date, and practical information and instruction in phlebotomy procedures and techniques
- Provide a comprehensive background in phlebotomy theory and principles
- In addition to blood collection skills, the student will demonstrate competence and professionalism for a successful specimen collection
- Good communication and public relations skills
- This course is appropriate for use as an instructional text or as a reference for those who wish to update skills or study for certification
- Working knowledge of the healthcare delivery system, and familiarity with clinical laboratory services.

Practicum course:

- Practicum course students practice the blood collection & handling skills learned in theory class
- Practice on simulation arms (mandatory) and live persons (based on volunteers availability)
- Receive instruction on how to prepare the blood collection site
- Choose the proper collection tools
- Post-puncture care, processing and management of collected samples

Fees:

- Course fee: \$1650+ HST
- Total package fee: \$1999 + HST [includes course fee, Canadian Phlebotomy Technician Group Inc membership fee (\$129+hst), CPTG exam fee (\$220+hst)]

Funding:

The program at the Canadian College of Healthcare and Pharmaceuticals is eligible for tax credits under the Canada Skills Credit program. The College also works with financial institutions including Windmill Micro lending to arrange supports for students loans.

Schedule:

Please contact us for more details. Typical program will be completed over two weeks (9 days) of which seven sessions of 4 hours will be scheduled over Zoom and two sessions of 6 hours will be scheduled in-person. The program is open for enrollment for 2022 and 2023.
